A community of faith nurtured him, supported him, and informed him. It is unthinkable that we would try to live a faithful life without the gifts offered in a faithful community of Jesus. Jesus was known for valuing solitude since he retired to rest and pray, but living in a community also marked his life....Jesus makes a dramatic and revolutionary promise when he says, "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (Matt 18:20) This is a welcome promise to those who may wonder if God is present in their lives or their affairs. This is a hopeful promise for those who sometimes feel alone and forsaken. This is an enormous assurance for those who face the unknown and need companionship and community.

The writer of Hebrews encouraged his readers to not lose heart or succumb to the temptation to fall away. "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching."

Community – whether in-person or online is a gift. I pray we will continue to celebrate its gift and embrace the ways God is calling us to join in the creation and sustaining of the beloved community.





A Pastoral Letter at Christmas to the People of the Western North Carolina Conference of The United Methodist Church, 2024

In his gospel Luke passes down the account of Jesus' birth, as seen and experienced by the eyewitnesses. The main characters along the way are Elizabeth and Zechariah, John the Baptizer and Mary, the mother of Jesus.

These are ordinary people, faithful people. God uses them to facilitate miracles, to transform lives. They are essential to the narrative of how salvation will be offered to all people, even to the Gentiles, even to you and me.

The scripture is fulfilled as God shows up, as God's people show up. God is faithful, and this inspires God's people to be faithful. "Let it be to me according to your word", Mary says. "Bear fruit worthy of repentance", John preaches.

Jesus was born in a particular place, Bethlehem, to a particular people. He was a Palestinian Jew, which means he was born in the land called Palestine, a land inhabited by Jews. In Jesus, God was doing a new thing, but all of this was in continuity with the promises of the ancient Word.

As followers of Jesus in a particular place, Western North Carolina, and within a particular tradition, United Methodism, we have experienced an extraordinary year filled with events that can be described as historical. We hosted a worldwide General Conference in Charlotte, and we experienced a devastating flood following Hurricane Helene in the mountains; these carried with them discontinuities. Yet the changes, even as they have included losses, have revealed gifts—we are now more open to all people, even all of our own people, and we have come together in our hour of need, with tangible expressions of food, shelter and presence.

And even as we live and serve in a particular place, Christmas has a way of enlarging our hearts and expanding our vision for the world that God loves. And so we pray especially for Nigeria and Ukraine, Israel and Palestine, and all people who are seeking daily bread, sanctuary and flourishing through migration.

Through the changes and disruptions God is faithful, and God's people are faithful; God has shown up, God's people keep showing up. And in the very midst of it all, a child is born. And the child, Jesus, is for a purpose: in the language of Charles Wesley's hymn, "born to give us second birth".

May it be so! Merry Christmas!
